Test obligation for passengers entering Germany

- <u>All passengers</u> entering Germany are obliged to show proof of a negative COVID test before boarding the flight.
- The airline is <u>not allowed to carry</u> passengers without a negative COVID test.
- If passengers weren't able to get a test done before departure, airlines can offer a testing possibility before boarding.
- Transportation of passengers with a positive COVID test is forbidden. Those passengers have to follow the local quarantine regulation.
- The test has to be a PCR test or an antigen rapid test with the specifications according to the recommendations of WHO and has to be carried out no more than 48 h prior to entry.
- The passengers have to carry the proof of the negative test when entering Germany as the Federal Police will do checks upon arrival.
- **Crews** and children up to 6 years are exempted from this new regulation.

This new regulation will be valid as of 30 March 2021 until 12 May 2021.

- The obligation to fill out a PLF and the local quarantine regulation when returning from a risk area, high risk area or an area of VOC are still valid.
