# Health Entry and Stay Conditions for Travellers

Interim Conditions v3.5; with effect from 13 September 2021; Ministry of Health.

**Key Changes from v3.4** – South Africa is removed from list of Restricted Countries; for remaining restricted countries, quarantine on arrival is shortened to 7 days, with day 5 PCR testing. All indicated day 5 testing for non-residents (including GOP-holders) will be at cost. Differentiation by vaccination status has been removed.

| Arrival and Stay | <ul> <li>Spend at least 14 days at sea from last port of call.</li> <li>All crew and passengers should be without symptoms of COVID-19 during this period.</li> <li>No need for Arrival or Day 5 PCR test.</li> <li>Earlier disembarkation is allowed provided all crew undertake a COVID-19 PCR test (at cost) upon arrival, with all results negative.</li> </ul> |

However, seafarers wishing to enter from a country on the restricted list must follow conditions as for GOP-holders entering from these countries.</li> <li>No pre-travel quarantine required.</li> <li>Negative COVID-19 PCR test done within 72h of departure from country of origin.</li> <li>Complete Health Travel Authorisation.</li> <li>Valid Health insurance to cover any potential COVID-19 related costs.</li> </ul>   |  |
| Arrival and Stay | <ul> <li>No quarantine required on arrival (except for arrivals from countries on the restricted list).</li> <li>Encouraged to directly board vessels and depart as soon as possible after arrival.
